Wine making program added to HACC curriculum

On March 2, the HACC Board of Trustees approved the addition of enology (wine making) and viticulture (grape growing) programs to the college's curriculum this fall. Students who enroll in either program will be able to earn an associate

degree in applied science or a certificate in this rapidly growing industry.

The viticulture and enology programs are intended to draw students from across the eastern United States, Canada, and other cool-climate grape growing regions. Classes will be delivered through online instruction and a blended format, which is a combination of online instruction and one or two weekend "camps" at vineyards and wineries in the region for required intensive hands-on experience. Built in 1925, The Brasserie was once home to Issacher Polk Reese and his sizable family. Reese was a successful Mennonite businessman and founder of Lancaster's historic Reese Padlock Company.
