

Harrisburg Area Community College Fall 2008 Student Profile

College-Wide

For the eighth consecutive fall term (beginning in 2001), enrollment at Harrisburg Area Community College (HACC) increased from the previous year. The total headcount (HC) of 19,886 students was 5.6% higher than the Fall 2007 figure (N = 18,840). This increase was reflected in both full time (FT) and part time (PT) registration. The number of FT students grew by 6.5% (2007 = 7,040 students versus 2008 = 7,498 students) while PT HC was 5.0% higher (2007 = 11,800 vs. 2008 = 12,388). These higher figures resulted in an overall full time equivalent (FTE) growth of 5.5% from fall to fall (2007 = 12,914.0 vs. 2008 = 13,624.7 FTEs).

When gender was considered, nearly two in three (12982/19886 or 65.3%) were females. This changed little from the previous year. Overall minority enrollment rose from 17.8% (3359/18840) to 18.6% (3697/19886). Additionally, more than half (10448/19886 or 52.5%) of the student population selected a career/technical major. The two Nursing programs (RN and LPN) remained the most popular followed by Business Management among career/technical majors, while Business Administration and Elementary Education enrolled the most transfer students. These findings mirrored past results.

Perhaps the most significant change in this reporting profile is the addition of the York Campus, HACC's fifth location. It is important to note that while York was officially approved by the PA Department of Education (PDE) for branch campus status in the 2007-08 academic year, its impact on enrollment HC at other locations, especially Lancaster, was significant. During the developmental years of the York location, students attending were counted at one of the four PDE approved campuses (Harrisburg, Gettysburg, Lancaster and Lebanon). The lion's share of the York enrollment was attributed to the Lancaster Campus.

As such, once PDE approval was awarded to York, many who were previously included in the Lancaster HC now were shifted to their actual home site. This resulted in a steep decline in total HC and FTE for Lancaster. However, these findings better reflect the students who are actually enrolled at each location. The Harrisburg and Gettysburg Campuses were also negatively impacted, but not to the degree associated with the Lancaster Campus.

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Finally, adhering to past reporting practice, a separate profile of the Virtual Campus, a site not approved for branch campus status by PDE, can be found in Appendix A.

Harrisburg Campus

Total HC at the Harrisburg Campus was slightly lower than the previous fall (2007 = 9,774 vs. 2008 = 9,699 or -0.8%). However, the drop in student HC was not shared equally, as those enrolled FT increased by 3.1% (2007 = 3,862 vs. 2008 = 3,981) compared to a decline of 3.3% for the PT population (2007 = 5,912 vs. 2008 = 5,718). The total FTE counts remained flat as a result of the nearly equal increase/decline (2007 = 6,815.0 FTE vs. 2008 = 6,813.3 FTE).

Females constituted three of every five (5864/9699 or 60.5%) students. This changed little from the previous year (5929/9774 or 60.7%). Likewise, total minority enrollment held steady at 19.4% of the total (versus 19.3% in 2007), as African Americans (5.6%) and American Indians (24.0%) were up while Asians (-5.0%) and Hispanics (-3.6%) experienced declines.

There were no significant differences from 2007 to 2008 in terms of program mix. Just over half in both years (2007 = 53.4% vs. 2008 = 53.3%) selected career programs, with Nursing (RN and LPN) and Business Management the most popular. On the transfer side, Business Administration was the largest followed by Criminal Justice, Elementary Education, and Psychology.

Enrollment held steady at the Harrisburg Campus as the change was less than one percent. Both gender and ethnicity/race were consistent from year to year, as well as program choice. As before, the largest career program was Nursing (RN), while Business Administration was selected by the highest number of transfer students.

Gettysburg Campus

Enrollment at the Gettysburg Campus rose 2.2% with a Fall 2008 HC total of 1,699 students versus 1,663 in Fall 2007. Similar to Harrisburg, the increase was not equally divided between FT and PT students. However, Gettysburg was unlike Harrisburg in that PT registration rose 3.7% (2007 = 1,119 vs. 2008 = 1,160) while FT enrollment fell 0.9% (2007 = 544 vs. 2008 =

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539). This was a reverse of the Harrisburg findings. Not surprisingly, total FTE increased only 1.2% (2007 = 1,102.3 FTEs versus 2008 = 1,115.4 FTEs), reflecting the modest HC growth.

The Gettysburg Campus continued to be attractive to females as they comprised nearly three-quarters of the population (1235/1699 or 72.7%). While the number of minorities increased by 5.3% (2007 = 133 vs. 2008 = 140), overall this segment of the student HC was just 8.2%. The largest minority group, Hispanics, grew by 22.6% (2007 = 62 vs. 2008 = 76), along with a 20% increase in Asians (2007 = 20; 2008 = 24). Conversely, American Indians were 25.0% lower (2007 = 8 vs. 2008 = 6) and African Americans dropped 20.9% (2007 = 43 vs. 2008 = 34). The generally low minority representation at the Gettysburg Campus reflects the general population in Adams County which is overwhelmingly White.

Program selection generally mirrored the college-wide results. Career majors topped the list as a majority (53.7%) selected programs in the career/technical field. About one in four (24.5%) opted for a transfer program. The proportions of career and transfer majors differ little from the 2007 results. On an individual program basis, Nursing (both RN and LPN) was the most popular for career options while Business Administration and Elementary Education were the leaders for transfer programs.

Even though Gettysburg continues to grow, the rate of expansion has slowed the past few years. Unlike Harrisburg, the number of PT rather than FT students increased. Females again made up nearly three-quarters of the student HC; minority representation reflected the Adams County population, which is much lower than other counties served by HACC; and career/technical majors, led by the Nursing programs, remained the most popular.

Lancaster Campus

The granting of branch campus status by PDE to the York Center in 2007-08 had a profound effect on the Lancaster Campus HC and FTE totals. The large majority of York students were included in the count for Lancaster Campus prior to branch campus approval. As such, the Lancaster Campus figures presented for Fall 2008 will be much lower than the previous year, even though it may have experienced an actual increase at its own location.

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Taking into account the above, total HC declined by 21.8% (2007 = 6,333 vs. 2008 = 4,952) as this current fall finding will serve to provide the new benchmark for future comparisons. The number enrolled FT was down 23.4% (2007 = 2,239 vs. 2008 = 1,714) with PT registration falling 20.9% (2007 = 4,094 vs. 2008 = 3,238). As a result of reallocating enrollments to the York Campus, total FTE at Lancaster was 22.8% below the previous fall (2007 = 4,279.5 vs. 2008 = 3,301.8).

The Lancaster Campus, like all others, is overrepresented by females who comprised two of every three (68.0%) students. This has changed little in recent years. Minority enrollment remained strong, as one in five (1043/4952 or 21.1%) were African American, Hispanic, American Indian, or Asian. In the Fall 2007 term, minorities comprised 18.9% (1196/6333) of the total HC, so the proportional comparisons were fairly similar.

Unlike Gettysburg and Harrisburg, less than half (49.3%) of all Lancaster students selected a career/technical major. Just over a quarter (27.6%) were in a transfer curriculum. The RN program was the most popular career major followed by Radiologic Tech, while Business Administration and Elementary Education led the transfer programs.

In summary, while it appeared that HC and FTE totals fell, this was actually the result of the York Center obtaining branch campus status and the allocation of York county students to the new location. Thus, new baselines for HC and FTE, which more accurately reflect actual attendance at Lancaster Campus, were established with the Fall 2008 totals. Females continued to make up a large majority, while one in five students at Lancaster was a minority. Career education was the option selected by most students, but the percentage total was less than half of the student population.

Lebanon Campus

Enrollment at the Lebanon Campus was a robust 18.6% higher than the previous fall (2007 = 1,070 vs. 2008 = 1,269) as a new record high was established for this campus. The growth was led by the jump in PT enrollment by 25.8% (2007 = 675 vs. 2008 = 849) while FT growth was a far more modest 6.3% (2007 = 395 vs. 2008 = 420). Due to the large PT increase, the FTE total

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was 13.1% higher (2007 = 717.2 vs. 2008 = 811.2), reflecting the fewer credits carried by those who only selected a course or two.

A review of gender found that nearly two in three (64.0%) were females. This continued a pattern observed over a number of fall terms. Minority student totals increased by 15.6% (2007 = 186 vs. 2008 = 215), as the number of Hispanic students was up by 15.3% (2007 = 118 vs. 2008 = 136) and the African American population enrolled 13.6% more (2007 = 44 vs. 2008 = 50). Overall, the proportion of minorities at the Lebanon Campus held fairly steady, with a 17.4% total in 2007 (186/1070) versus 16.9% (215/1269) in 2008.

By major, the smallest percentage of career students was associated with the Lebanon Campus, as over two in five selected this option (548/1269 or 43.2%). Surprisingly, the beneficiary of the low career major total was not the transfer program, but rather those in the College in High School (CHS) program. The increase in CHS HC was 155.3% (2007 = 94 vs. 2008 = 240). Transfer students comprised about a quarter of the student HC (24.0%). Given the large jump in CHS students, it is clear that this program played a significant role in affecting the Lebanon Campus HC. Nursing was the most popular career major and Elementary Education was top for the transfer option.

The Lebanon Campus experienced a strong increase in student enrollment as both the FT and especially PT registration grew. Females continued to outnumber males by nearly two to one and minorities, especially Hispanics, did well. Finally, while the largest group selected a career major, perhaps the most important development was the rapid growth in the CHS program. Totals from the CHS Program confirmed that it played a significant role in the growth experienced by the Lebanon Campus.

York Campus

The inaugural fall term at York as an official campus witnessed the enrollment of 2,267 students, 844 who were FT (37.2%) and the remainder registered on a PT basis (N = 1,423 or 62.8%). A total of 1,580.0 FTEs were generated by these students.

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By gender, three in four (75.2%) were females, giving this campus the highest percentage of women at any location. Minority students comprised 18.5% of the total, as African Americans (N = 242) and Hispanics (N = 132) were the two largest groups.

Not only did York have the highest percentage of females, but more than three in five (61.0%) selected one of the career/technical majors. This was the largest proportion of any campus. Nearly a quarter (24.5%) enrolled in a transfer program. Nursing (RN) and Dental Hygiene were the most popular career programs while Business Administration and Elementary Education led the transfer option.

The initial semester at York proved to be very strong, with an enrollment going beyond the 2,200 mark. Female and minorities were well represented and career/technical majors were selected by a majority of students. Comparison data for the York Campus will be presented in Fall 2009 with the 2008 data as the benchmark.

Appendix A – Virtual Campus

The Virtual Campus (VC) continued to grow, with a total enrollment of 4,242 students. This was 15.7% higher than the Fall 2007 total of 3,667 students. An increase of 14.8% was measured among the FT population (2007 = 1,252 vs. 2008 = 1,437) while the PT segment grew by 16.1% (2007 = 2,415 vs. 2008 = 2,805). A total of 6,698 registrations (up from 5,708 or 17.3%) generated 19,851 credits, or 16.8% more than the 2007 total of 16,998. Females comprised three of every four students (74.0%) and minorities made up 13.3% of the VC population, just above last year's 12.5% (2007 = 458 vs. 2008 = 560).

Harrisburg continued to enroll the largest virtual group (N = 2,301) followed by Lancaster (N = 871) and then the newest location, York (N = 513). Just over one in three (35.5%) enrolled in only VC courses. This proportion was nearly identical to the Fall 2007 total (35.2%). Finally, the top career program was Nursing – RN (N = 755) while Business Administration led the transfer option (N = 286). General Studies was also very popular, with 464 students.

The VC courses remain a vital option for many students, as the number registered surpassed the 4,200 mark. Generating 19,851 credits, the VC courses generally augment the traditional

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classroom instruction, given that only about one-third enrolled solely in VC courses. Ongoing expansion of VC courses looks promising given the strong enrollment demands.

Summary

Overall, HACC continues to grow and for the eighth consecutive fall term a record enrollment was established. Of particular note was the awarding of branch campus status to York, the fifth location. While growth was apparent college-wide, it differed greatly from location to location. Strong increases were registered by Lebanon and, to a lesser degree, Gettysburg. Declines were experienced by Harrisburg and Lancaster. However, the Lancaster totals were negatively impacted by the establishment of the York Campus and the redistribution of York students to their home location. Females were a large majority at all locations, minorities continued to be fairly well represented, and a majority of students continued to select a career/technical major, with Nursing (RN) the most popular.

Finally, the VC continues to be very popular, with more than 4,200 students. As in the past, a large majority of students selected a VC course along with the traditional classroom format. Expansion of the VC courses is conditioned on meeting both student demands and securing significant numbers of trained instructors. If aligned, the future of the VC courses appears very bright.
