Hello, my name is Kathy Brickner and I am the executive director of facilities and real estate at HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College. The safety of our students, employees and communities is our highest priority, therefore HACC's five campuses remain closed and students will continue to attend classes and receive services remotely in the fall. However, we will resume limited on-campus instruction for the hands-on components of approved credit and workforce development programs. Please note that only students and employees in the approved programs, as well as essential employees, are authorized to be on HACC's campuses and those individuals approved to be on the campuses are required to wear personal protective equipment. HACC is following the guidelines and recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and the Pennsylvania Department of Health. Our custodians and facilities staff received training for proper use of personal protective equipment and electrostatic disinfecting sprayers that are being used to disinfect classrooms, bathrooms and common areas. Custodians are using deep cleaning process, which focuses on the following: deep cleaning and disinfecting touch points, disinfecting hard surfaces, fleet and instructional vehicles and certain equipment, vacuuming and cleaning carpets, floors, ceiling lights and diffusers. This list will continue to grow and all of the disinfecting products that HACC uses have been approved to eliminate COVID 19. Our facilities staff are monitoring our building systems to ensure proper airflow cycles and all filters have been recently changed and will be maintained on a stepped-up cycle. The facilities team also established restricted entry and exit points for buildings. The number of classrooms has been reduced. Hallways were redesigned for controlled movement with floor signage to maintain the six-foot distance. And all classrooms have been set up to ensure proper student spacing. We will continue to provide updates. Thank you.
